Sooner or later, life's difficulties bring every Christian to God's doorstep with questions too personal to ignore. Why does God allow me to go through such painful circumstances? If He loves me, why does He seem indifferent to my prayers? Life has a way of bringing out the theologian in all of us. The moment the word "Why?" crosses our lips, we are doing theology. Life also exposes our need to know God better, and the hardest places are often where He does His best work in us. In the story of Mary of Bethany we'll travel the well-worn path of those who follow Jesus.. Even those who've heard Mary's story a hundred times will be surprised at what she has to teach us about the difference knowing Jesus makes.

Carolyn Custis James (M.A. in biblical studies) is president of *Whitby Forum*, a ministry dedicated to help Christians go deeper in their relationship with God and to encourage men and women to serve God together in every sphere of life. She speaks at church conferences, colleges and other Christian organizations both in the US and abroad and serves as a visiting lecturer at theological seminaries. Her books (read by both women and men) include *When Life and Beliefs Collide*, *Lost Women of the Bible*, *Understanding Purpose*, and *The Gospel of Ruth*. She is the founder and president of **Synergy Women's Network, Inc.**—a national organization of women emerging or active in vocational ministry. She loves to drill down deeper in to familiar passages of Scripture to unearth more of the Bible's riches.

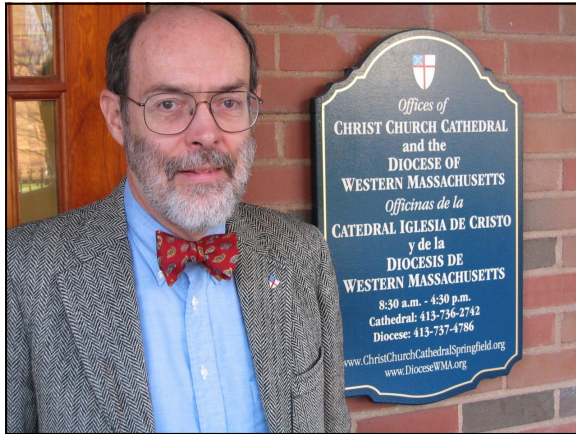

About Bruce:

Bruce Rockwell serves Assistant to the Bishop for Stewardship in the Diocese of Western Massachusetts. In this position, he is responsible for the stewardship formation programs in the diocese.

Bruce recently retired from his position as Financial Officer (and Assistant to the Bishop for Stewardship), having served over ten years in that role. And prior to that, he had served in a similar capacity in the Diocese of Rochester for twelve years.

Bruce has been a stewardship consultant since 1985. He has served as a consultant to dioceses in many parts of the US and Canada. He has led diocesan stewardship conferences, has been a keynote speaker at numerous parish stewardship dinners, has offered lay stewardship sermons to congregations in many of the same dioceses, and has worked with dioceses and parishes in planning year-round stewardship formation programs. He has also trained diocesan stewardship consultants in several dioceses and trained lay parish stewardship volunteers in his own diocese and in many others.

Bruce has a banking background, having served as a banker in Rochester, NY for 21 years. He was Vice President and Manager of Human Resources when he left the banking industry in 1986. He notes that he finds it interesting that after helping people acquire and hold on to material wealth during his career as a retail banker he now finds himself "working the other side of the street," helping people realize the joy of giving of their wealth. He says that he finds this much more fulfilling.

Bruce is a long distance runner who has run races of every distance from a mile to a marathon. While he says his competitive racing days are behind him, Bruce still runs regularly as a way to be a steward of the physical body God has entrusted to him. He also finds that when he is running by himself, it provides a time for meditation, prayer, and for admiring the beauty of God's creation.
